### UWSS Reunion 2000 Held In Panama City Beach

A total of 49 people attended, including wives, friends, and teammates in the Panama City area. Special thanks goes to "Doc" Riojas for his efforts, time, website newsletters, and personal expense over the past two years to make it happen.

The weekend events included registration and an Ice Breaker on Friday afternoon, a business meeting Saturday morning, a great dinner and festivities that night, and tours of the Experimental Diving Unit and the Diving School on Sunday morning. In between these events many enjoyed the beach or shared sea stories and lies at Dusty Rhodes' Down the Hatch lounge outside the Navy Base. Others that made the weekend event happen were Ron Douglas who ran the Small Stores, Joe Kruppa and sons who oversaw registration, and Bob Barth and Woody Woodard who set up tours of EDU and the Diving School respectively.

Retired Captain Ron Yeaw, UWSS graduate and former CO of UDT 21 and DEVGRU, was the guest speaker at the Saturday night dinner. He had some great things to say about what the school meant to him and the UWSS staff's contribution to the U. S. Navy. Don Stone, retired HMCS, ST 2 plank owner, and former UWSS instructor and BUDS instructor, followed Captain Yeaw and shared his favorite diving stories. Soon others got up and related their stories of the UWSS and the people involved. Keeping the evening's events going, including the after dinner raffle, was the master of ceremonies, Bob "Doc" Clark, retired HMCM, who did a super job as usual. Winner of the award for having come the farthest was John and Mary Hobbs from Seal Beach, CA. Second place went to Art Wigdahl (UWSS '62) and his wife Celia who came from Guadalajara, Mexico.

At the business meeting, proposals for the location of the next UWSS reunion in early May 2002 included Las Vegas, NV; Little Creek, VA; Roosevelt Roads, Puerto Rico; and Coronado, CA. Once the details on the feasibility of these places to support a reunion are known, members will vote their preferences. Other business included the election of new office holders for the next two years. They are: Don Stone - President, Andy Anderson - Vice President, and A. Dee Clark -Secretary/Treasurer. Later when he was not around, Doc Riojas was nominated and appointed without vote to be the UWSS historian and keeper of the archives. And, because Chuck Micele did such a great job with the invocation before dinner Saturday night, Doc Clark as the master of ceremonies, designated him to be the permanent UWSS chaplain.

The Fraternal Order of Underwater Swimmers School (now the official name) intends to publish the newsletter called the "Buddy Line" quarterly, and hopes to get the word out to former UWSS students and staff for a bigger turnout in two years.
