Scuttlebut Corner

Last issue's Scuttlebut told the story of two student divers getting some bottom time with the MK5 when one of them was bitten on the hand by a moray eel. One of the calls we received as a result of the reunion publicity gave us the ending to the story.

The caller, Chris Seger, had kept in touch with several of the guys in his 1961 swim school class and was setting up a mini reunion with them when he saw the FO UWSS reunion notice in Naval Institute Proceedings. He was surprised to find the Stone in the reunion notice was the same Stone as the one in his class picture. During the mutual reminiscing Chris informed us the two ensigns in the moray eel incident were Topper Sargent, who was bitten by the eel, and his swim buddy, Otto Holmberg. He finishes the story thus:

"I was topside in the LCPR when they surfaced. The water was turning blood red from Topper's wound and when he raised his arm to grab the ramp it was running down his arm. No panic, but I about peed in my shorts. I forget how many weeks Topper had to stay in Key West to recuperate, but we were glad to get him back in Indian Head after the wound healed."
