
Buddy Line by email

George Zipp

FO/UWSS Plankowner, George Zipp, died Thursday, Feb. 3, 2011. He was born in Brooklyn, NY on October 27, 1926. He married Margaret Lenehan December 5th, 1948 and they shared a cherished life filled with love, family, friends and the joy of living.



George was a veteran of the Korean War and during his 22 years of service in the Navy he served on the USS Toledo, USS Tusk, USS Torsk, USS Croaker, USS Dace and the USS Lake Champlain. He graduated from the US Naval Underwater Swimmers School in 1955 and became an instructor at the New London Naval Base Scuba Diving Tank. He retired from the United States Navy as a Senior Chief Quarter Master. George was then employed as a Weight Engineer at the Electric Boat Company in Groton, CT from which he retired in 1986.

After retiring, George and Margaret spent many years traveling through the United States in their camper. George was a Master Gardner and often shared the fruits of his labor with neighbors and friends. He is survived by Margaret, his "bride" of 62 years, five loving daughters, their husbands, four grandchildren, a brother and several nieces and nephews.
