UWSS Reunion 2002

Information on possible sites for our 2002 reunion is starting to come in from members John Hobbs, Bob Clark, Andy Anderson and A. Dee Clark. However the information is still too incomplete to ask the members to make any kind of decision. Here's a summary of the information we have received to date on the proposed sites:

Roosevelt Roads, PR - Info from Andy Anderson

Airfare to Puerto Rico would run about \$500 from Miami. Cars would have to be rented to take the participants from San Juan to Roosevelt Roads, a 1½-hour drive. Hotels in Fajardo start at \$100 per night for not so nice to \$200-300 for very nice. There is a base Navy Lodge that takes reservations. Guest quarters on base would be space available. The NSW unit there would support us with a tour.

Las Vegas, NV – Info from John Hobbs

John contacted the Circus Circus Casino and they emailed me 30 pages of menus and other food service information. Banquet costs depend on the number of people and the lavishness of the meal, ranging from \$24.75 to \$43.45 per person (including tax and gratuity). Room rates are \$84.00 per night. There are several retired SEALS in the area who would help us set up a reunion. Recreation in the area would basically be the casinos or the desert. As for tours, I don't know of any government special warfare units close by.

Little Creek, VA - Info from Bob Clark

Lots of retired UWSS, UDT and SEALS in the area to help with setting up a reunion. Base billeting and banquet rooms would be available to handle between 80-100 people. There is also a Days Inn near the gate. Many recreation facilities are available including Seal Park for picnics, beach pavilions, Gator Water Park, campground, and golf course. We can get a tour of either a SEAL Team or the Diving unit. No prices yet, but Bob is working on it.




The gang at the first reunion of Underwater Swimmers School in 1998
